### Beltsville is Rocked by Three Natural Disasters

The end of August and beginning of September brought an interesting experience for Beltsville residents: a 5.9 earthquake on Aug. 23, 2011, hurricane Irene, and flooding, some of which caused the loss of power for many residents.

Many residents of Beltsville and surrounding areas could tell you exactly what they were doing during the earthquake, a rare occurrence and touted as the strongest in the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area since 1897.

Carrie Wright said she was cooking and wondered what was happening. Once she realized it was an earthquake, she said she was unnerved by it. Later she named her meal "earthquake chicken."

Nancy Manili, credit manager, was at work and said she crawled under her desk, thinking it was an atomic bomb given the proximity to Sept. 11. She claimed she learned to do that when she was in elementary school as a child. Some of her coworkers at Adams-Burch, Inc., also crawled under their desks until Rick Gallagher, vice president of operations, announced a temporary evacuation of the building.

Four days later, hurricane Irene struck the Beltsville area causing wind damage to homes, trees, and

power lines, as well as flooding and debris. Many residents lost power.

In a median across from Susan Zook's home, a large tree uprooted and fell, pulling on the power lines and snapping the telephone pole in three places.

Pepco worked fervently to return power to Beltsville residents, some who were without power for three days.

The week after hurricane Irene, Beltsville was under flood warnings because hurricane Lee came up the east coast dumping several inches of rain in the area throughout several days. Chrissy McGirt called the fire depart-

ment when she noticed the rain weighed a tree limb down and it caused a power line to spark and smoke.

The fire department responded and informed McGirt there was nothing they could do; they passed the call on to Pepco. Pepco responded to the scene just an hour later and said there was nothing they could do, either; they passed the call on to a tree-trimming company.

If it had not been raining, the branch would have caught on fire, but the power was still on. Two hours after Pepco left



Kierre McCune is the Park and Planning official who led a six year effort leading to the approval of the 2010 Master Plan for the area in Northeast Prince George's County including Beltsville. His successor, Tamara Jovovic, now has responsibility for this Sub Region 1 plan. Their presentation to the September 21 meeting of the Greater Beltsville Business Association highlighted the history of the creation and approval of the plan with some significant features.

"By setting new 'land use' designations for properties, the plan avoids immediate zoning tax changes," Mr. McCune said. "Only when the business puts in place a new land use will the property incur a new assessed value."

Thomas F. Aylward, Jackson Shaw, a GBBA member of the Board of Directors, chaired the program and noted this significant approach in the plan. Jackson Shaw is developing the Brick Yard project in the Muirkirk area east of Route 1 in Beltsville and is now approaching the construction phase.

The GBBA audience included a wide array of Beltsville leaders including Karen Coakley, Beltsville Citizen's Association, Galeb Gould, Konterra Development, Laurel Development officials, Silver Spring's Urban Partnership leader, Carmen F. Camacho, Dr. John Moynihan, Beltsville Dentist and Ted Ladd, *The Beltsville News*, as well as many Beltsville business leaders. Dr. John Moynihan and Ted Ladd are well known Rotary and Lion's Club leaders.

Topics that came up in the discussion included plans for Konterra, street scapes for key portions of Route 1 in the southern part of the plan, and an extension of the Metro Green Line paralleling MARC train rail bed with a Muirkirk Metro stop adjacent to the MARC train station. Given the economic conditions, the Metro stop and plans to bury power and phone lines along Route 1 in what is considered Beltsville's main business center, may not be realized any time soon.

Details of the plan will be reviewed by GBBA to see what may possibly be implemented to strengthen Beltsville as a community destination for families and businesses considering relocating. Businesses interested in working with GBBA on this project are invited to call Paul Zurkowski, President, 301.931.8222.

The area plan is fully described in a 200-page interim-planning document. The final version of the plan is expected to be available in 4 to 6 weeks. 

#### Jobs should be priority for special session of legislature

Delegates Barbara Frush, Joseline Peña-Melnyk, Ben Barnes and I, along with our colleagues in the legislature, expect to consider several jobs measures to tackle the ongoing unemployment crisis. The special session's primary focus will be redistricting for the congressional and school board maps in the state, with the legislative districts scheduled to be redrawn in January.

#### New bike trail in Beltsville

Last month the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning hosted a public meeting to kick-off the design of a new trail that will close the gap between College Park and Fairland Regional Park in Laurel. The new trail will start where the Paint Branch Trail ends at Cherry Hill Road in College Park and connect to the Beltsville Community Center where it will meet the existing trail along the Little Paint Branch. These trails are part of the growing 20+ mile Anacostia Tributary Trail System that links parks, neighborhoods, and Metro stations in northern Prince George's County for hikers, bikers, and equestrians. Projected construction of the Beltsville section would start in

### **Proposed Legislation Threatens** Volunteer Fire Departments

On behalf of the men and women of the Beltsville Volunteer Fire Department, I am writing to express our vehement opposition to the proposed changes in legislation that will affect the Prince George's County Volunteer Fire Commission and were submitted on September 19, 2011 by County Executive Rushern Baker.

These proposed changes were submitted without first sitting down with the Volunteer Leaders that represent the 38 VOL-UNTEER Fire Corporations in Prince George's (PG) County to discuss potential alternatives and the adverse affects the changes will bring.

Currently the Fire Commission is comprised of 9 men and

women who are Volunteer Fire/ EMS personnel within PG County and are voted into office by the 38 VOLUNTEER corporations that they represent. Collectively they bring over 300 years of fire service experience to the

That they are one of the few agencies's within the County that have maintained a balanced budget for the last 2 years is evidence that they are fiscally responsible. The proposed legislation wants to change the Fire Commission to an advisory board that would consist of 3 Career Fire/EMS personnel, 3 Volunteer Fire/EMS personnel, and 3 citizens and they would be appointed

The VOLUNTEER fire corporations of PG County own approximately 75% of the apparatus and fire stations of the Prince George's County Fire Department, and provide a significant portion of the staffing - particularly on

> days. To restructure the Volunteer Fire Commission as we know it would be detrimental to our existence. Fire trucks and ambulances that need maintenance would be out of service longer, volunteer fire corpo-

nights, weekends, and holi-

rations would lose members, and fire stations could potentially have no staffing when you need

# St. John's Episcopal Church, Zion Parish, Celebrates Its 200th Anniversary

Saint John's Episcopal Church, Zion Parish, is celebrating its 200th Anniversary this year. Zion Parish was established in 1811 by the Episcopal Diocese of Maryland. Services were first held in Old Paint Branch Chapel, somewhere in the Calverton area. The history of the parish has seen its share of trouble, with the church being destroyed and damaged over its long history by fires, storms, a tornado, and lightning. Nevertheless, the church and its membership, over its 200year span, have been resilient and dedicated to the service of God and community.

The original church, established in 1811, fell into disrepair and a new chapel was given in 1825 to Zion Parish. In 1826, Zion Church was built near Vansville. In 1847, Zion Church Vansville was destroyed by storm and fire. In 1856, land was given for St. John's, Zion Parish by John Brown for a new church and cemetery in Beltsville. In 1857, the frame and building were erected as St. John's Episcopal Church, Zion Parish on its present site at 11040 Baltimore Avenue, Beltsville, MD. During the Civil War, the churchyard was used as an artillery site by the Federal troops. Cannon fire was exchanged with Confederate troops at White House Tavern, nearby. One Union soldier was killed.

In 1867 the Church was destroyed by fire again, and a new

brick building rebuilt in 1868. Some bricks for the church were taken from English ballast ships. Again, in 1874, St. John's Church was leveled by a windstorm, and rebuilt in 1877.

In 1923, St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, College Park, was established as a mission church of St. John's, and ceded from St. John's. The following year, 1924, St. John's built a Parish house.

Like many other churches across the nation, on May 7, 1945, V-E Day, World War II ended in Europe, and St. John's steeple bell was rung in celebration of the end of the war. Unfortunately, in 1967, St. John's steeple was struck by lightning. There was no fire, but a lightning rod was installed.

In 1966, St. Mark's Episcopal Church, Fairland, which had been yoked with St. John's as a Zion Parish church, became an independent parish. Saint Mark's is located on Old Columbia Pike, in Silver Spring, Maryland.

Once again, St. John's was victim to church damage in 1972 when a fire, thought to be arson, began in the church Parish Hall. The church sustained major smoke and water damage. Fire companies from Maryland, Virginia and Washington, D.C. responded to the fire. The Parish Hall and the church were refurbished shortly thereafter. In 1991, a new Parish Hall and addition to the church were built which

included the Church Office.

Throughout its long, tumultuous history, St. John's Episcopal Church, Zion Parish has remained a healthy, vibrant community of God, resilient in faith and dedicated to service to the community. The Parish has a diverse membership of persons from throughout the world, of every age, ethnicity, and culture, who worship as one to the glory of God every Sunday at 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. The parish is a SHARE food program site, which provides groceries to people throughout the community at vastly discounted prices.

A festive Bi-Centennial service will be held on Sunday, Oct. 2, 2011, at 10 a.m. when St. John's will celebrate its 200 years of faithful ministry to God and the community. All are invited to come to this service of celebration, or visit this wonderful parish any Sunday. Sunday School for children begins at 9:45 a.m. on Sundays, from Sep., through May. All are welcome to come and join this exciting, 200 year old community known as St. John's Episcopal Church, Zion Parish.

October is Fire Safety Month. Please share these Halloween safety tips with friends and family.

Before children start out on their "trick or treat" rounds, parents should make sure that an adult or an older responsible youth will be supervising the outing for children under 12 years of age. Teach your children to stop only at houses or apartment buildings that are well lit and never enter a stranger's home. Establish a time for children to return home.

Motorists: Your job is to watch for children and their parents, as they too will be sharing the roadways and sidewalks this holiday season. Be very careful for anyone that could dart out from parked cars. When traveling through residential locations please be mindful



of the speed limit that is posted and allow for pedestrians to cross at designated cross walks.

Costume Design: Only fireretardant materials should be used for costumes. Costumes should be loose so warm clothes can be worn underneath. Costumes should not be so long that they create a tripping hazard. Falls are the leading cause of unintentional injuries on Halloween. If children are allowed out after dark, outfits should be light colored materials. Strips of reflective tape should be used to make children more visible.

Face Design: Masks can

obstruct a child's vision; use facial make-up instead.

**Accessories:** Knives, swords and other accessories should be made from cardboard or flexible materials.

Do not allow children to carry sharp objects. Bags or sacks carried by youngsters should be lightcolored or trimmed with reflective tape if children are allowed out after dark. Carrying flashlights will help children see better and be seen more clearly.

On the way: Remind your child not to enter homes or apartments without adult supervision. Walk, do not run, from house to house. Do not cross yards and lawns where unseen objects or the uneven terrain can present tripping hazards. Walk on sidewalks, not in streets. Walk on the left side of the road facing traffic if there are no sidewalks.

Treats: To ensure a safe trickor-treat outing, parents are urged to give children an early meal before going out. Insist that treats be brought home for inspection before anything is eaten. When in doubt, throw it out.

worn off.



### High Point's Jiminez Discusses Budget with Alumni

In the midst of class change, students walked the familiar halls of High Point High School and noticed something a little different – a group of approximately 30 High Point graduates following Principal Sandra Jimenez on a tour of the building on Friday, Sept. 16, 2011

These weren't just any High Point graduates; this was the class of 1961 returning to their alma mater after 50 years. The graduates were greeted in the Media Center by a presentation from Jimenez and then taken on a tour where Jimenez answered any questions the alumni had for her. Presented were facts about the school and the changes the student body, as well as staff and faculty, have undergone in the past six months.

"Things have changed so much," said Jimenez as she discussed the importance of finances in a school such as High Point where such a limited budget is given to operate from August to June. Jimenez mentioned the poverty level present at

the school and how it has made an impact on families.

Due to budget cuts, the school lacks valuable programs, but with donations, Jimenez plans to provide important services to the students. These programs would include free coats or school supplies for families who can't afford them, GED programs, etc.

"The truth of the matter is that there's a new guitar class with 30 or 40 kids and only 10 guitars," Jimenez clarified as she spoke on behalf of the fine arts department's lack of funding for their classes. That was just one example of the many needs of the school.

In addition, athletic programs at the school raise their own money for new uniforms or equipment. Jimenez believes when students are at the school involved in extracurricular activities, it means they are not out on the street or causing trouble. Therefore, Jimenez would like to see more support given to these teams by way of contributions.

The alumni asked whether or not their possible donations would go to the school or straight to the county. Jimenez assured them there are regulations and procedures whenever a school receives money, but High Point would ultimately get it.

The school can take the slightest amount of money and stretch it to go a long way and make an impact on the overall school environment greatly.

One alumnus, questioning the potential progress of the county's public school system, asked, "Is there a light at the end of the tunnel?"

Jimenez replied, "I see hope."

This mentality is exactly what High Point and its community wants and is thankful to her for it.

With budget cuts constantly on the rise, students and teachers alike ponder over the fate of their school and extracurricular activities. With 220 schools in the Prince George's County Public School system, it is hard for High Point High School to receive the necessary funding for special programs and renovation. This year's graduating class and all future classes look to alumni to help make the difference.

the scene, the branch became so heavy with rain it rested on the power line. There was an electrical buzz, a bright light, and a loud boom, followed by the complete loss of power. An hour later, Pepco returned to trim the tree and restore power to the area.

In the weeks following, Beltsville residents saw crews in the area trimming trees away from power lines to help prevent power outages.


